## Frequently Asked Questions

### Who can participate?

You may qualify for the study if you:

- Identify as an ethnic and/or racial minority.
- Are currently enrolled as a freshman or sophomore at a participating college or university.
- Have a condition—blindness, visual impairment, acquired brain injury, a learning disability, ADHD, or a physical disability—that may qualify you for electronic textbooks in accessible formats.

### What are the benefits?

Contribute to scientific knowledge and receive up to **\$275 – \$375**.

### How long is the study?

The study will begin in Fall '16 and continue through Summer '19. Participation will require about two hours of your time per year over 1-3 years, depending on the length of your program of study.

### Will my name be in the research?

No, all student participation in the research project will be kept confidential.

### What do I have to do?

Notify your Disability Service Office of your interest in the study! You will be asked to complete several surveys per year and may participate in focus groups.
